New SAF/FM Mission Statement

The Selective Transaction History (STH) Refresh is now available via Info Analyst using the server URL <https://crisweb.ogden.disa.mil/eoy>.

Like the DSR and PSR Refresh, STH query designs built in regular CRIS will not work on STH Refresh. You will have to build new query templates for STH Refresh. The STH Refresh will be a significant aid in researching accounting activity, especially at closeout. STH Refresh will update at the same interval as DSR and PSR (schedule determined by DFAS). Your MAJCOM CRIS functional analyst will have to add STH to your Refresh roles. You can contact the AFMC MAJCOM POC, Mr. J.D. Lawson, with any questions.

TRAINING AVAILABLE

As the fiscal year closes out, and you find that you are needing training, fear not – SAF/FMPT has help available 24 hours a day. Through an internet connection you can access on-line training for FIRST; Automated Funds Management (AFM); Air Force Timekeeper; Budget Tools – Automated Target Loading Program; Obligation Adjustment Reporting System (OARS); Standard Fiscal Code (SFC) and Commander's Resource Integration System (CRIS). Log onto <https://lms.afbudsys.disa.mil> or go through the FM Knowledge Mgmt site <https://km.saffm.hq.af.mil>, then select FM Tools, Systems, Learning Mgmt Sys (LMS) option, self-register and immediately begin using this on-line tool .

UNIT COMPLIANCE INSPECTION (UCI)

Oklahoma City Air Logistics Center received an overall “Excellent” rating during a recent compliance inspection, 13 Jul – 25 Jul 2006. Months of preparation and hard work were rewarded by acknowledgement of the good work being done at Tinker AFB.

CAMP (CENTRALIZED ASSET MANAGEMENT PROGRAM) UPDATE (FORMERLY CALLED FUTURE FINANCIALS)

OAC 87 (AFMC) will assume responsibility in FY07 for EEICs 578, 583, 594, 699 and 69302. The funding associated with EEICs 578, 583, and 594 will be transferred via D-22 from the MAJCOMs to OAC 87 for execution. Funding will be distributed by PEC and EEIC based on the Financial Plan and prioritization by the Lead MAJCOM beginning with the initial distribution as soon as possible in FY07. EEICs 699 and 69302 (AVPOL) will be issued directly from Air Staff to OAC 87 and will be managed as a single, central OAC 87 account. Procedures will be provided separately to cover AVPOL. Funding and execution responsibility for all other EEICs will remain with the MAJCOMs as it is today. Funding shortfalls will be addressed through the appropriate area of responsibility and the normal unfunded priority process. The CAMP PMO has established two CoP sites for information dissemination. The Funds Flow link has little data in it at this point, but will be the location where funding information is posted, to include copies of official budget documents. Depot Purchased Equipment Maintenance (DPEM) EEICs 54X and 560 are expected to migrate to OAC 87 in FY08.

To do this, you must complete 80 hours of Continuing Professional Education (CPE) in every two year period following the issuance of your certification. One unit of CPE is awarded for each 50 minutes of contact time engaged in activities below.

 - Attendance at professional conferences
 - Teaching and course preparation for relevant subject matter
 - Preparation and delivery of briefing and work-related documents outside the scope of routine business
 - Reading of articles in professional journals

If you are not already a CDFM, now is a good time to get started. The CDFM designation can help you compete for promotions and the best jobs. You may prepare for the CDFM exams by taking the one-week Enhanced Defense Financial Manager (EDFM) course or by self-study. The FY07 schedule should be available on the ASMC website as early as 01 Sep 06. Also, there is now an optional fourth module of the CDFM exam dealing with the rules governing acquisition of major defense systems.
