TOP INDUSTRY NEWS STORIES

House Passes Teleworking Bill Earlier this month the House passed the Telework Improvements Act (HR 1722) requiring agencies to expand teleworking opportunities for employees. The House had taken up the bill in May, but failed to get the votes necessary to pass the bill under a special procedure. This time the bill came up under normal procedures requiring a simple majority to pass. The House bill is similar to that passed by the Senate (see Highlights, May 28, 2010) in late May. The bill requires agencies to develop a teleworking policy and identify eligible employees. The bill does exempt, except in emergency situations, employees whose daily official duties require the direct handling of secure materials or involve an on-site agency where duties cannot be performed remotely. In addition, the bill gives authority to agencies to conduct a telework travel expenses test in which agencies could pay travel expenses for teleworking employees who are required to come to the office more than a set number of times. The expansion of teleworking in federal agencies has received strong support from the Office of Personnel Management and a number of federal employee organizations. Supporters hope to conference the bill quickly and send it to the president for signature.

Secretary Gates Announces Closures, Personnel Freezes, and Contractor Funding Cuts On 9 Aug 10, Secretary Gates announced a wide-ranging plan to achieve the \$100 billion savings goal he called for in Jun 10 to support force structure and proceed with modernization. To reach this goal, Gates said in a news conference that the Pentagon would shut down some high profile DoD organizations, reduce the number of senior military and civilian personnel, cut back on contracting, and make other overhead reductions. These actions, if implemented, will result in the loss of thousands of civilian and contractor jobs. The Secretary said that the "department must start setting priorities, making real trade-offs, and separating appetites from real requirements." FY10 Department of Defense Managers' Internal Control Program (MICP)

As of Sep 10, OSD-Comptroller briefed the specific requirements/attributes of an effective Managers' Internal Control Program (in accordance with DoD Instruction 5010.40) with each of the 36 Components that are currently required to annually submit a Statement of Assurance directly to OSD. The briefings emphasized were:

- Importance of Director/Commander Support (aka "Tone-at-the-Top")
- Reliance upon a "risk-based framework"
- Implementation of "self-reporting concept"

Leverage of the Component's in-house expertise, e.g., those staff assigned to specific sub functions, e.g., assessable units, within organization versus dependency upon "outside" audit agencies, e.g., DoDIG, GAO and military audit agencies, to identify and report "material" internal control weaknesses and recommendations for mitigation of risk through changes in related controls.

"**Tone-at-the-Top**" is a term that is used to define management's leadership and commitment towards openness, honesty, integrity, and ethical behavior. It is the most important component of the control environment. The tone at the top is set by all levels of management and has a trickle-down effect on all employees.

For a Managers' Internal Control Program to be effective, the respective Component needs senior management's support through:

- **Communication** - Management must clearly communicate its ethics and values throughout the area they manage. These values could be communicated formally through written codes of conduct and policies, staff meetings, memos, etc., or informally during day to day operations.
- **Active Participation** - Kick-Off and Quarter Meetings - Discussions relevant to internal controls, and associated risks
- **Reporting** - Create and promote path for employees to self-report and feel safe from retaliation
- **Reward Active Participation** - Creation of Commander's Award - Recognition of Successful Internal Control Activity

WHY CDFM?

The ASMC has found that being awarded the Certified Defense Financial Manager (CDFM) certification offers multiple benefits. When CDFMs were asked about the benefits of earning their certification, 22% of respondents stated it "established credibility in my organization," while 14% stated they were "hired for a new position." 12% of respondents stated they received a promotion after being awarded their CDFM, 9% stated they received a pay raise, and 7% stated they earned additional rating points on their evaluation. Other benefits included being asked to serve as a mentor (7%), asked to represent their organization on financial issues (4%), and being invited to speak or write an article for publication (3% each). ASMC has found that employers continue to seek individuals with the CDFM certification. A recent check of financial management-related positions in the Washington DC area found over 100 employment opportunities where CDFM was either a preferred or desired certification.

NEW WEBSITE UPDATES
